Urinary Incontinence: *The role of medication*

The third new pharmacotherapeutic topic for 2023 to be offered as a local education activity for GPs as practice visits and proudly supported by General Practice North is 'Urinary Incontinence'.

Urinary incontinence affects approximately 25% of the adult population. About 75% of patients with urinary incontinence do not seek medical advice and treatment for their problem.

After participating in this educational activity GPs should be better prepared to:

- ✓ Describe the different types of urinary incontinence
- ✓ Identify medications that can cause or aggravate urinary incontinence
- ✓ Educate patients on the non-pharmacological management of urinary incontinence
- ✓ Choose a suitable medication for the type of urinary incontinence if considered necessary
- ✓ Determine if a medication prescribed for urinary incontinence is effective and balance this against the actual or potential medication related harms.

Presenter: Danielle Truscott, General Practice Consultant Pharmacist and Educator.
